Pastor's Corner "For God's gifts and calling can never be withdrawn; God will never go back on God's promises."

- Romans 11:29, (TLB)

Friends, did you know that God expects us to live faithful lives? God will always keep every promise made to us, and God desires us to keep the covenants we have made, even when we encounter great difficulty keeping them. In contrast, our society today is abounding with broken promises, so much so that broken promises have become the norm, and promises that are kept have become the exception rather than the rule. People used to seal business deals with a handshake, but today the simplest agreement is filled with fine print listing both what each party promises to do as well as the recourse each party has if the contract is broken. What a sad commentary of our ability as humans to live faithful lives, our ability to do what God expects!

However, in the verse above, the Apostle Paul reminds us that, "the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable" (NIV). That means, that even though we sometimes fail to live our lives faithfully to God's call, the Almighty will never take back the gifts that have been given to us, and God will never reject us or withhold love from us. In spite of our weakness and sin, we are promised that God's love for us will never end. To those whom God has called, God is faithful; God will never leave us or forsake us. As Jesus loved his disciples "to the very end" (John 13:1), God has promised to love us to the end as well.

What kind of lives, then, should we be living? God isn't looking for polite or guarded or "correct" responses of love from us. Rather, the LORD is looking for hearts abandoned to God in love, hearts overwhelmed by the promise of faithfulness to each of us. Only when we see how dearly we have been loved will we be able to live faithfully. Let us look again at the gifts and the call of God in our lives. Let us recount God's miracles of healing, protection, and provision. Then, let us renew our promises to live faithful lives of love and service to our God. We have received so much from God in the call and the gifts with which we have been bestowed. So, let us return to God, then, the only gift God really desires—our humble, contrite hearts yielded to our LORD in faithfulness!

April 29 to May 3 were busy but joyful days of medicalevangelism with a big family of Dominicano, Haitian & U.S. servants. I'm thankful for how we have seen God at work in

the DR since 2013 and am very hopeful that He'll continue to redeem His own there. We were privileged to care for 678 patients, working alongside pastors and colleagues in *The Luke Society* led by Samuel & Dr



Silvia Martinez. However, as Chuck Colson penned, "God doesn't want our success—He wants us. He doesn't demand our achievements—He demands our obedience."



A decade ago we held clinics in the tiny church of pastor Carlos Heredia. He asked this year if we could use his larger-but-under-construction one in mercy and gospel outreach to his community.

During a site-visit on Tuesday, Silvia & I viewed saws, shovels, cement bags, re-bar, welding supplies, rock-piles &

more everywhere! Then we remembered "BUT GOD!" and knew it could work with space for Registration & Waiting, our 6 MDs, Triage, Lab & Pharmacy. Carlos assured us his flock was eager to serve & would have it ready next morning. They did!

Carlos & Socorro opened their home for 3 remaining stations (PT, Readers & Ultrasound) then invited us and patients to use their bathroom.

As always, my "R hand" Sally Mercer managed clinic flow with her warm smile!



Patients in many other countries don't have easy or affordable access to physical therapy or diagnostic ultrasound. Repeat-servants Steve Wolters & Kim Mistisshen shared their clinical experience, spiritual maturity and

hearts of mercy to bless patients & teammates alike. Lynn Limon was PT Steve's interpreter, and Diana Mercado assisted sonographer Kim. Kim's non-medical husband Steve returned as "oculista" to help fit patients 40 years old and up with readers.



What a gift to be "midwife" at the birth of a new believer. Susan Service had welcomed Roberto Ramón to Triage, took his vital signs and learned he had diabetes & hypertension. She also discussed his spiritual health which led Roberto to ask questions about the gospel. When it was his turn for a doctor, Susan took him to Dominicana MD Urania Suarez. Urania shared more about the One Who could become Roberto's Savior and watched as Holy Spirit revealed the Way, Truth & Life to open his heart and seal his salvation. "Praise God from Whom all blessings flow!" (We sing this at close of each clinic day... we want to be like the one leper out of 10 who returned to thank Jesus for his healing.) Both Dr Urania and Samuel will follow Roberto medically & spiritually, connecting him to the local church for discipleship and fellowship.



We often chuckle with our patients as **Dr Won Kim** did with this family. When he said to the *niña* in blue, "Abra la boca", they all opened "Ahh!"! Won says, "it never fails." Praise God, these healthy kids simply needed loving (& fun) exams and for their mother, an encouraging "Good job!" along with an invitation to Carlos's church.



"Let the children come to me," Jesus said. (Mt. 19:14) Fluent in Spanish, pediatrician Craid Lem is great at welcoming them into his 'office' & sharing Jesus.



and send back to sponsored children for holidays. Through World Vision Ghana, sponsors are helping 17,000 boys and 18,700 girls to improve their reading.

World Vision, through this program, goes into whole communities and provides not only schooling, but help with water, crops, and health education. Thank you for supporting this endeavor.
